### History of Cheltenham Festivals

Since the discovery of its spa waters Cheltenham has been known for refreshing the body and soul. Cheltenham Music Festival was then conceived in 1945, in the darkness of World War 2, as a response to the worst of humanity by celebrating the best of humanity and lifting the human spirit through music.

A pioneering spirit was demonstrated further with the world's first Literature Festival following in 1949. As the town marked itself out as a town for culture and intelligence (now cybertech), it launched a Jazz Festival in 1996 and the UK's first Science Festival in 2002. All quickly established themselves as leaders in their fields in the UK

With the festivals established, the charity widened its focus to increase opportunities for talent development and to build a bold and innovative schools and outreach programme.

Clarity on our mission and vision propels us into the future. Building upon all that has been established to date, Cheltenham Festivals will continue to deliver excellence in all we do, building our reputation in programming, sustainability in the urban festival sector, community engagement, inclusion and the innovative use of technology.
